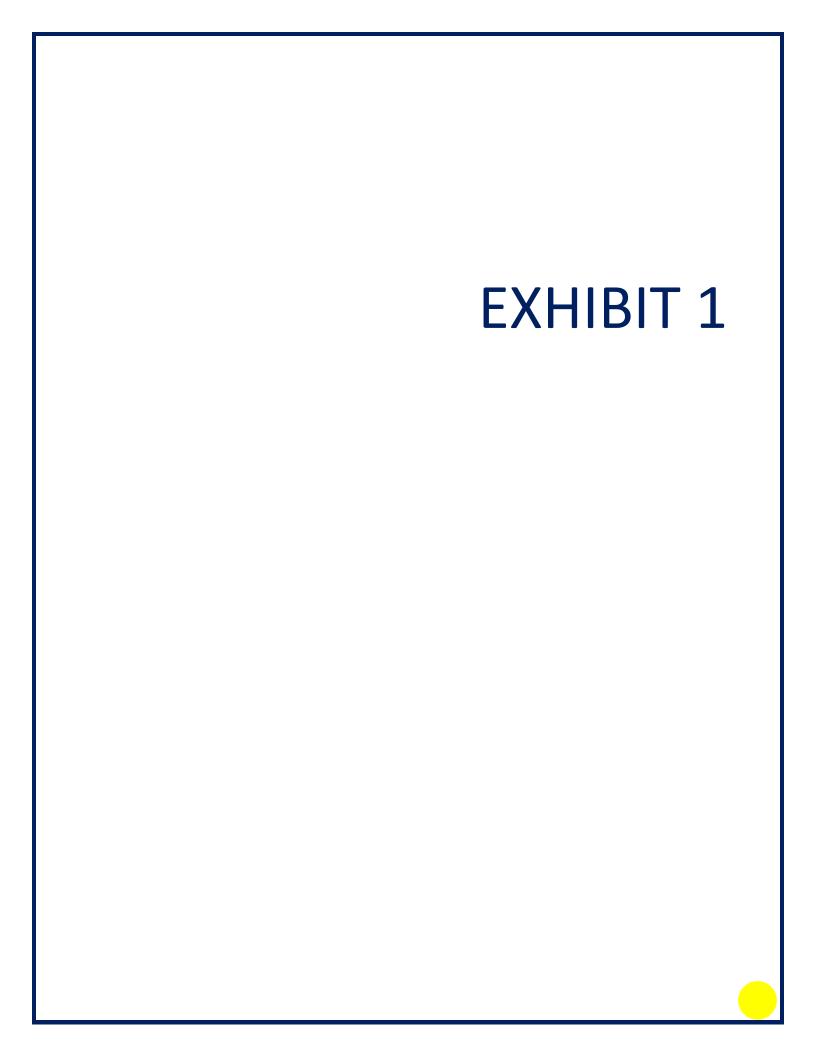

PROPOSAL

Proposed For: Saddle Creek Preserve HOA

Date: October 23, 2025

Service Period: One-time project

This proposal covers the removal and restoration of the ten pine tree islands located along the main entrance of Old Mining Road. The existing decorative grasses within these islands have become severely overgrown, creating visual obstructions and safety concerns—particularly near the intersection and school pick-up area with high traffic volume. Each island currently contains approximately 25–30 large mounds of decorative grass that will need to be completely dug out, loaded, hauled away, and disposed of at the dump. All existing mulch and organic remnants will be removed, and the soil will be leveled and properly prepared. Once cleared, the areas will be refreshed with matching pine straw mulch consistent with the material used at the community's front entrance and other landscaped sections. The newly defined mulch beds will establish a clean, uniform appearance and prepare the islands for future planting opportunities. This project involves multiple trailer loads of debris and several dump trips due to the volume of material being removed.

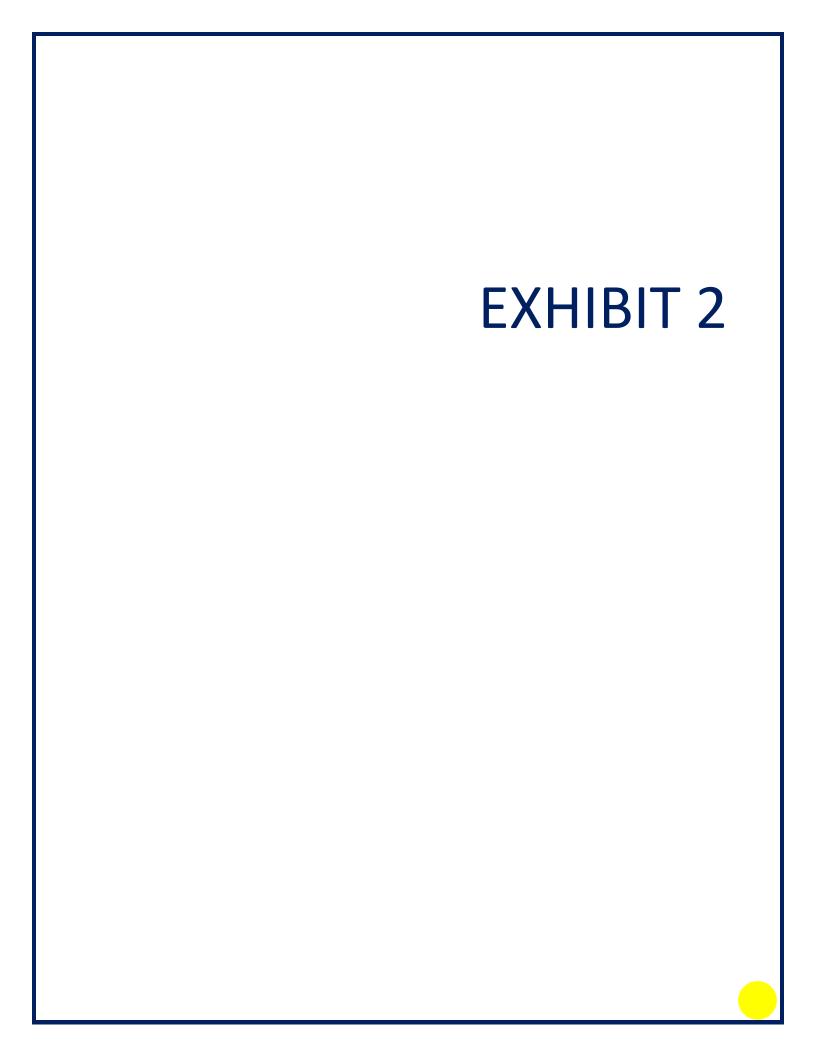

Fallen Log and Debris Removal - Saddle Creek Rd.

Date: October 22, 2025

Scope of Work

Along the hedge line of Saddle Creek Road, several newly fallen logs and debris have been observed. These include branches and tree segments that have recently come down and are now obstructing the area. Additionally, there are a few larger sections of pine tree left behind by the tree maintenance company that serviced the front of the district. These remaining pieces will need to be cut into manageable sections, collected, and properly disposed of to restore the area to its intended condition.

Services Included

- · Cutting up and segmenting newly fallen logs and debris along the hedge line.
- · Removal of remaining pine tree sections left by previous maintenance crews.
- · Collection, loading, and transportation of all debris to the appropriate disposal facility.
- Final cleanup of the affected area to ensure a neat and uniform appearance.

Total Cost: \$250.00

Clearing the newly fallen logs and leftover pine sections will prevent obstructions along the hedge line and maintain the clean, maintained appearance expected throughout the district. Prompt removal also ensures these materials do not attract pests or interfere with scheduled maintenance. The work will restore a uniform landscape consistent with the surrounding maintained areas.

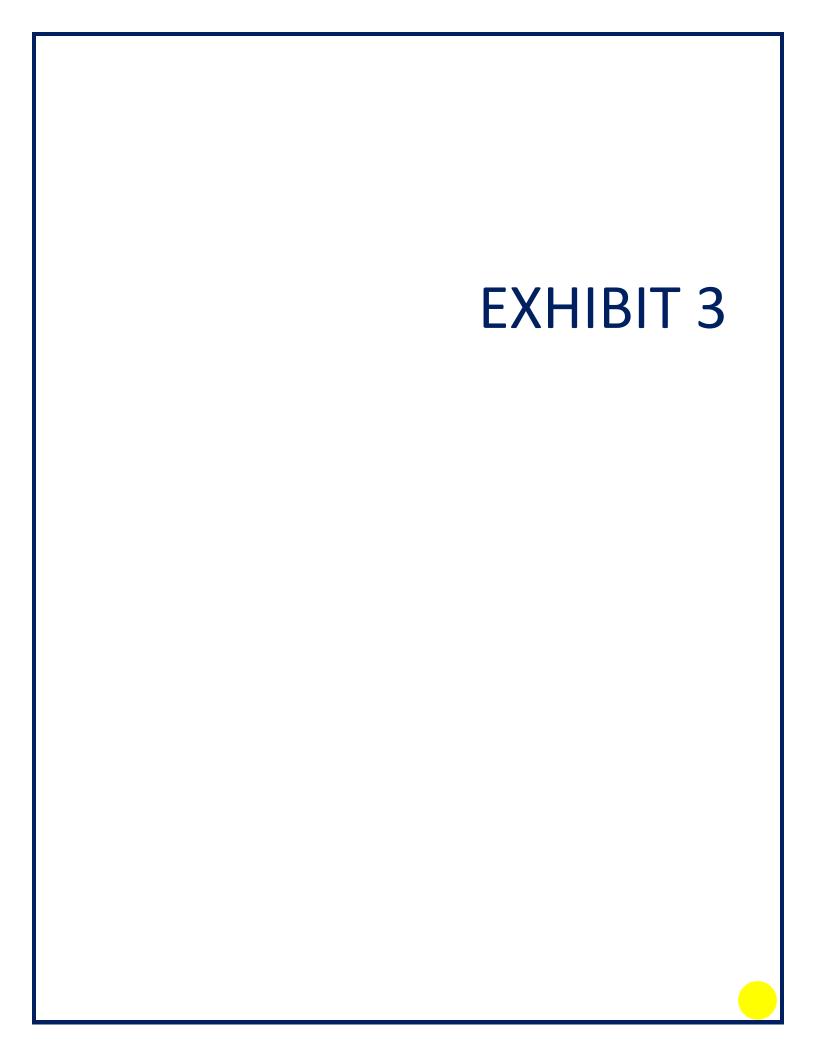

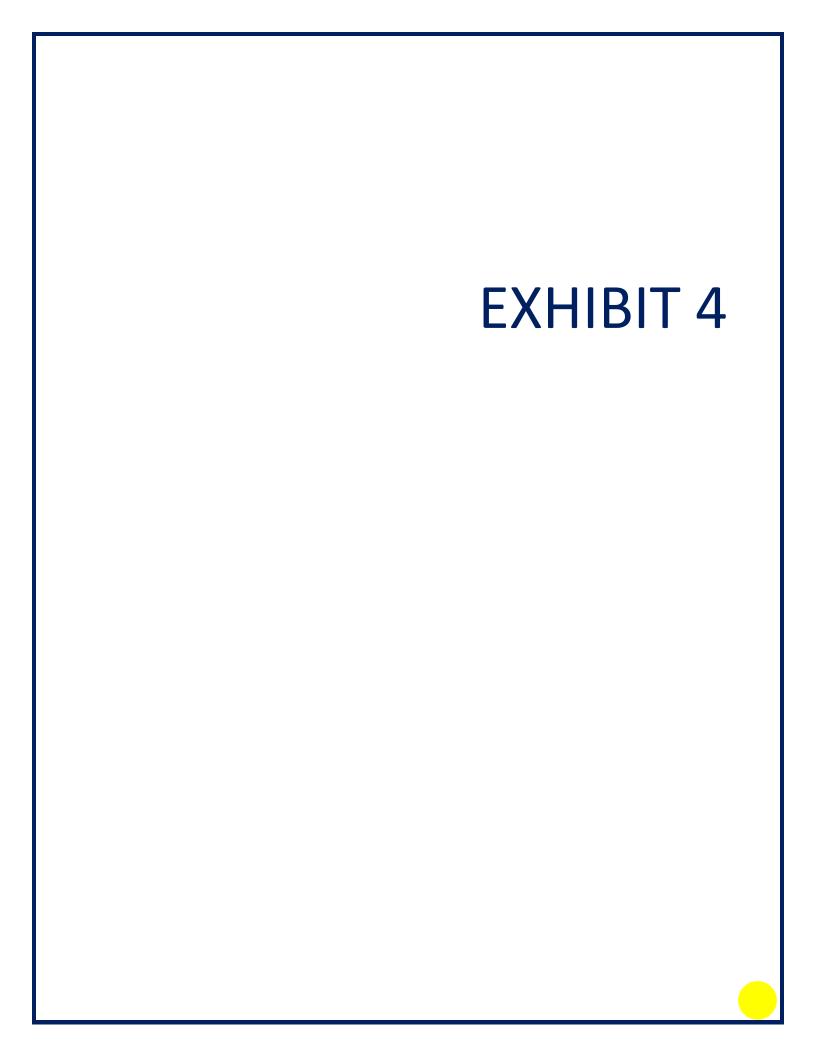
This proposal covers stump grinding and restoration for the area located at the intersection of Gatsby Rd and Saddle Creek Rd. There are a total of eight pine tree stumps of varying sizes currently present within this section, creating difficult access and ongoing maintenance issues along the corner. Fast Property Services LLC proposes a full restoration of this area, beginning with mechanical stump grinding to remove all stumps to an appropriate depth below grade. Following stump removal, site preparation will include cleanup of debris, light grading, and soil preparation to ensure proper surface uniformity for new sod installation. Finally, new sod will be installed to restore the area to a clean, finished appearance consistent with the surrounding landscape. This process will significantly improve accessibility, mowing efficiency, and the overall visual presentation of the community entrance.

Scope of Work

At the gated entrance of the lift station on Old Pasture Road, there is a large hedge that is completely dead and shows no signs of recovery. Since the area is within a gated access point, removing this hedge will not detract from the overall appearance of the landscape. In fact, its removal will create a cleaner, more uniform look and simplify ongoing maintenance by allowing the area to flow naturally with the existing, healthy hedge line.

Services Included

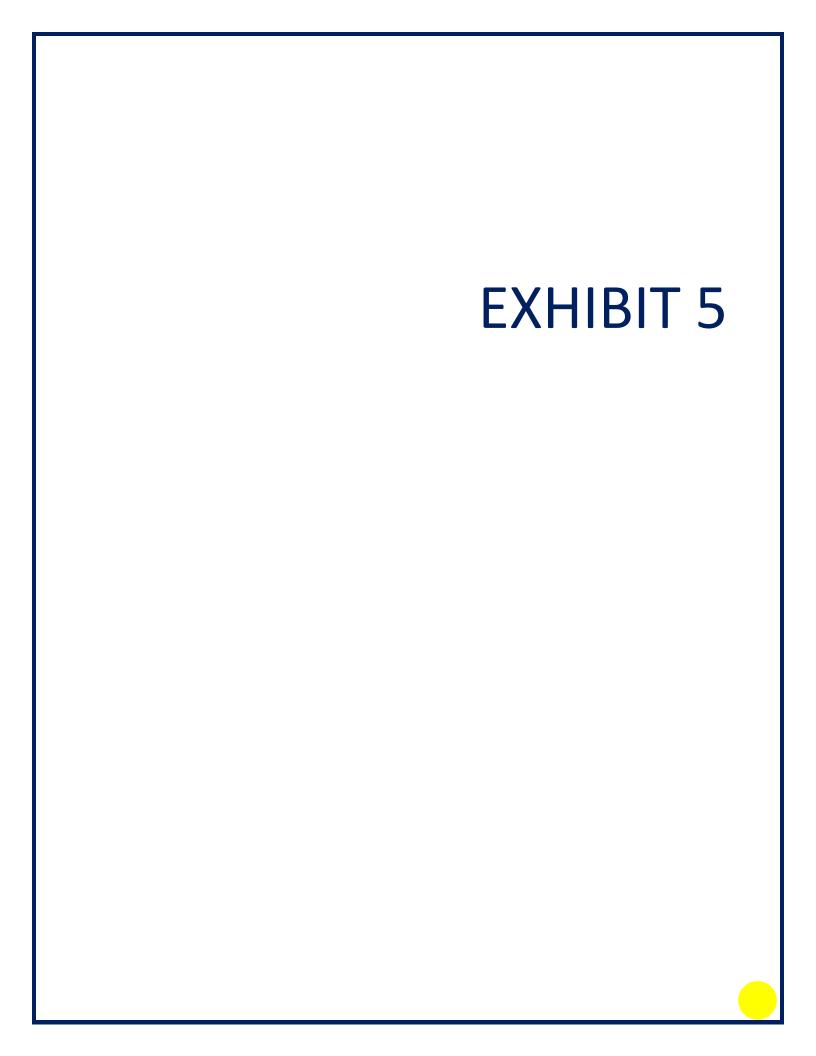
- Complete removal and disposal of the existing hedge, including root extraction.

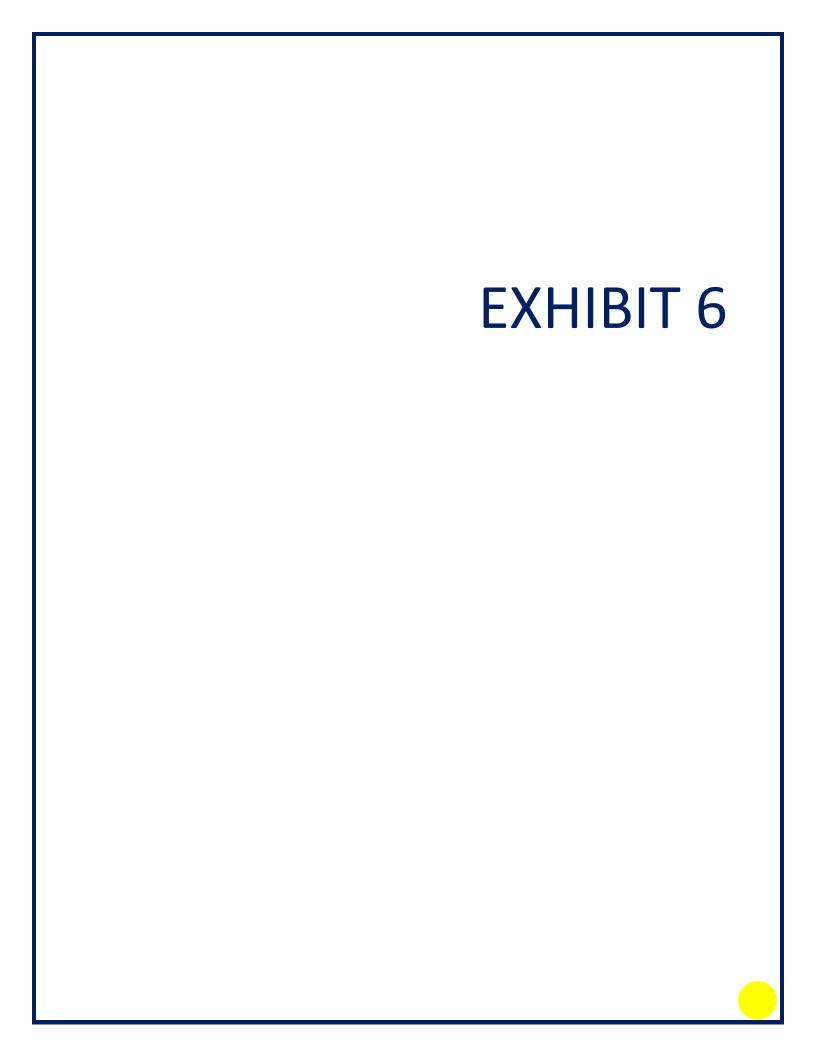

This proposal covers the installation of pine straw mulch along the remainder of the front hedge line, focusing primarily on both the Teneroc Trail and Gatsby Ln entrances. Both stretches of entryway hedges along Saddle Creek Rd. will receive the same pine straw mulch application that was previously completed at the main entrance and within the flowerbeds. The purpose of this work is to maintain consistency and improve overall weed prevention throughout the community's frontage. The results of prior installations have clearly demonstrated a significant reduction in weed growth and a notable improvement in appearance and maintenance efficiency. By extending the mulch to these remaining sections, the goal is to complete the front hedge line coverage and reduce ongoing labor needs. This installation reflects a very similar quantity and scope to the pine straw installation completed behind Yellow Trail, and once complete, it will finalize the mulching for the front hedges along Saddle Creek Rd.

This proposal covers the removal of all existing pine bark mulch from the landscaped areas surrounding the pool parking lot and the islands and perimeter areas around the mail station within Saddle Creek Preserve. The current pine bark nuggets are loosely scattered and frequently migrate into the parking lot, grassy areas, and general entryway to the pool, creating an untidy appearance and maintenance issue. Fast Property Services LLC will remove and dispose of all existing mulch, including transportation and dump fees. The areas will be redefined with a clean, deep edge to help retain the new mulch material and prevent washout or spreading. After removal and cleanup, pine straw mulch will be installed throughout these areas, continuing the established theme that has proven effective for weed prevention and a clean, cohesive appearance across the community. As part of this project, existing hedges and boxwoods will be trimmed, shaped, and repositioned where needed to achieve a more uniform and visually appealing layout. This work will provide a cleaner and neater aesthetic around the pool parking area while reducing future weed growth and debris accumulation. This project also serves as preparation for the upcoming landscaping reset within the pool area itself, which will follow the same pine straw mulch theme established throughout the community.

Scope of Work

This proposal covers pressure washing of the full sidewalks surrounding the circumference of the cul-de-sacs located at the end of both Yellow Trail and Red Road, including the entry driveways to the lift stations at these cul-de-sacs. In addition, it includes cleaning the full sidewalks located along both the east and west sides of the main entrance at Old Mining Road. The areas to be serviced extend from the Saddle Creek Preserve entrance signs to the lift station on the east side, and from the entrance to the first residential property line on the west side (Red Road).

All sidewalks and adjoining entry areas will be pressure washed using a professional surface cleaner and a mild detergent solution. This approach will effectively remove surface grime, organic growth, and general discoloration while avoiding damage to the concrete. Based on current conditions and prior observation, these areas are expected to clean up very well and will significantly improve the overall appearance of the community entrances and public walkways.

Services Included

- · Pressure washing of all sidewalks at both Yellow Trail and Red Road cul-de-sacs.
- · Cleaning of both lift station entrance driveways.
- Pressure washing of all sidewalks along Old Mining Road east and west sides, extending as described.
- · Application of mild detergent to enhance cleaning and restore a uniform finish.
- · Full rinse and final inspection to ensure a clean and professional appearance.

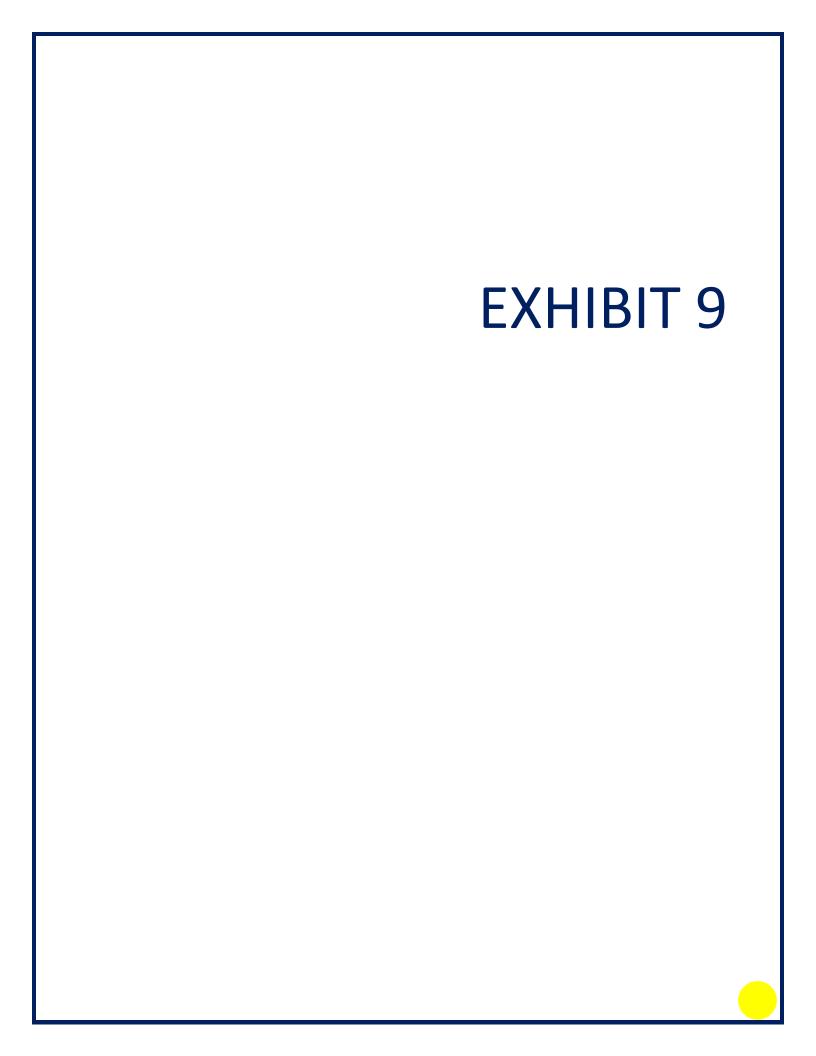
A Chemical Soft Wash and rinse of the vinyl fencing panels located behind Yellow Trail. The total area consists of 51 panels of tan vinyl fence, each measuring 8 feet in length. This results in a total of 408 linear feet. The service will include a gentle chemical application using a low-pressure soft wash system to lift and remove organic staining, mildew, and dirt without damaging the fence. A clean water rinse will follow to neutralize and refresh the surface. Below is the pricing breakdown:

This proposal covers the complete cleanup and professional washing of both fenced lift station areas located within Saddle Creek Preserve. Work will be performed at both the Bridle Booster Lift Station, located at the end of Bridle Booster Rd., and the Yellow Trail Lift Station, located at the end of Yellow Trail. Both areas are heavily overgrown and require comprehensive cleanup and surface restoration. Services include full vegetation removal, weed eating, trimming, and disposal, followed by the application of a post-emergent herbicide treatment to prevent regrowth. After vegetation cleanup, Fast Property Services LLC will perform a detailed soft wash of the fencing and surrounding concrete pads, cleaning both sides of the fencing and concrete surfaces. Low-pressure, environmentally safe methods will be used to remove organic buildup, mildew, and surface staining without damaging surrounding landscaping or turf areas.

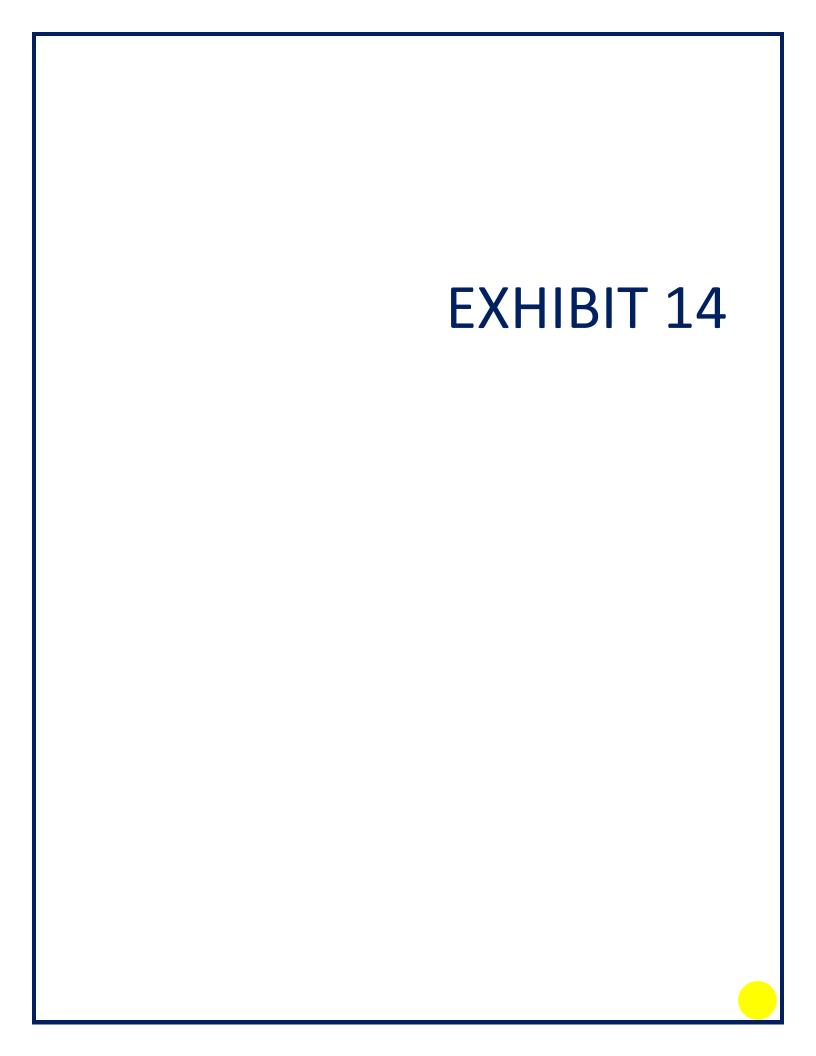
SECTION 1. Heath Beckett is hereby designated as the Registered Agent for the Saddle Creek Preserve of Polk County Community Development District.

Key Requirements

• Width: 20 feet (6.1 m) clear width, exclusive of shoulders.

- Vertical Clearance: 13 feet 6 inches (4.1 m).
- Surface: Must be designed to support fire apparatus and provide all-weather driving capability.
- Turnarounds: Required at dead ends longer than 150 feet (46 m) and must be maintained clear.
- Obstructions: No obstructions, including parked vehicles, are permitted.

Why These Requirements Matter

• Allows for Traffic and Operations:

The 20-foot width accommodates two-way traffic and allows one fire engine to operate at a fire hydrant while another vehicle passes.

Ensures Safety:

The vertical clearance ensures fire apparatus can safely pass under bridges, power lines, and other overhead obstacles.

• Maintains Accessibility:

The requirements for surface, grade, and turning radius ensure fire apparatus can safely reach any part of the building.

• Authority of the AHJ:

The <u>Authority Having Jurisdiction</u> (AHJ), such as the local fire code official, has the authority to modify these requirements to suit the specific needs and capabilities of the fire apparatus in their jurisdiction.

National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) codes for fire department access roads.

- NFPA 1 18.2.3.5.1.1* Fire department access roads shall have an unobstructed width of not less than 20 ft (6.1 m) at all times.
- NFPA 1 18.2.3.5.1.2 Fire department access roads shall have an unobstructed vertical clearance of not less than 13 ft 6 in. (4.1 m).
- NFPA 1 18.2.3.5.3.1 The turning radius of a fire department access road shall be as approved by the AHJ.

- NFPA 1 18.2.3.5.3.2 Turns in fire department access roads shall maintain the minimum road width.
- NFPA 1 18.2.2.2 For access to gated subdivisions or developments. The AHJ shall have the authority to require fire department access be provided to gated subdivisions or developments using an approved device or system. (If the Subdivisions or Developments has a security/access gate(s).)

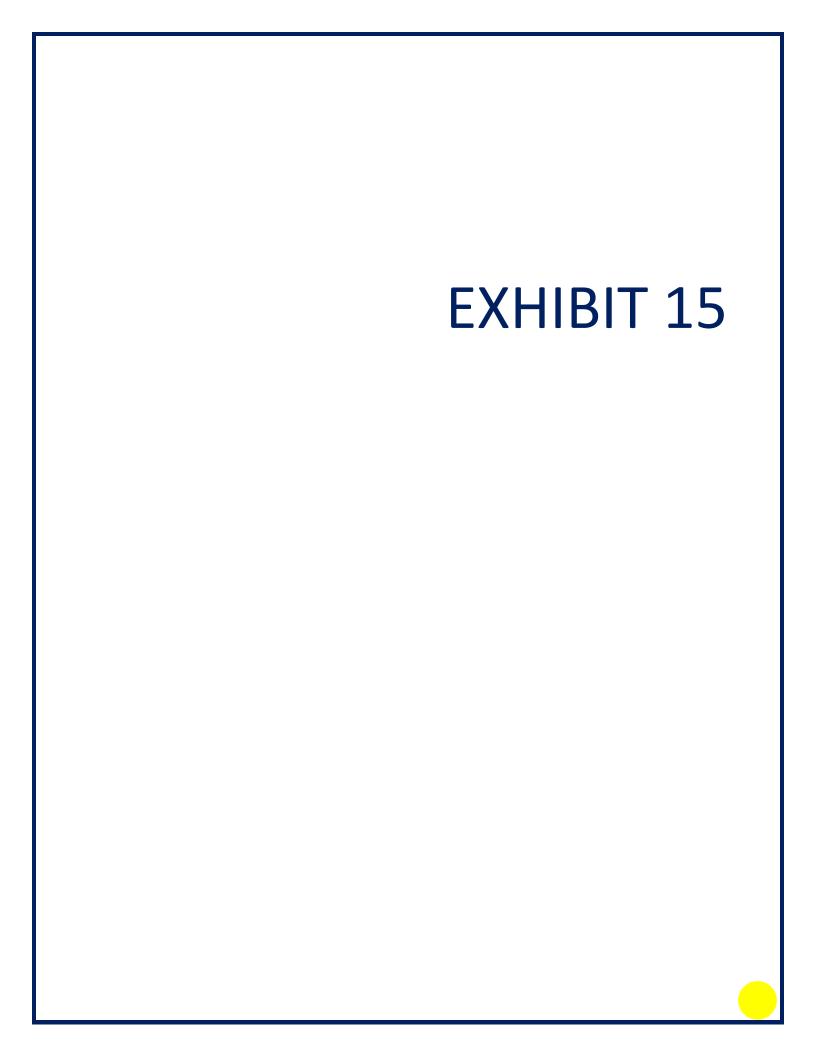
